

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The above-entitled matter having come on to be heard on February 19, 1998 before the Nevada Commission on Judicial Discipline (the Commission), Frank J. Cremen, Esq. appeared as Special Prosecutor for the Commission, Respondent Terrance P. Marren not being present nor represented by counsel. The Special Prosecutor having moved the Commission to dismiss the formal statement of charges on the grounds that he had no additional evidence to present other than the probable cause hearing transcript, and that the burden of proving that discipline was warranted by clear and convincing evidence could not therefore be met. Now, good cause appearing therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the facts presented at the probable cause hearing do not meet the burden of establishing by clear and convincing evidence a violation of the Canons of Judicial Ethics. Therefore, the complaint in the above-captioned case is hereby dismissed.
