Respondent knows and 25 understands the factual allegations and the sections of the Nevada Revised Code of Judicial

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Conduct applicable to this case.

- 2. On May 31, 2019, a Verified Statement of Complaint ("VSC") was filed against Respondent in Case No. 2019-090. Respondent knows and understands the factual allegations and the sections of the Nevada Revised Code of Judicial Conduct applicable to this case, as well.
- 3. Respondent disputes the factual allegations contained within each of these respective matters.
- 4. Respondent and the Commission agree that the allegations set forth in these matters, if proven by clear and convincing evidence, could result in disciplinary action against the Respondent.
- 5. Respondent agrees to waive her right to present her case in any of the matters that exist against her before the Commission and further agrees, notwithstanding her dispute of the factual allegations within each of these matters, that she will not contest these allegations in a formal hearing pursuant to Commission Procedural Rule 18. Respondent also agrees that this Stipulation and Order of Consent to Resignation and Resolution of All Pending Matters Involving Commission and Respondent ("Order") takes effect immediately, pursuant to Commission Procedural Rule 29. The Commission accepts Respondent's waiver of said right and acknowledges and agrees to the immediate effect of this Order.
- 6. Respondent further agrees to waive (and the Commission agrees to accept Respondent's waiver of) all of her rights pursuant to NRS 1.4673 and NRS 1.4677, including but not limited to:
 - a. The right to proceed to hearing on the allegations against her (NRS 1.4673(1)).
 - b. The right to have any of the allegations against her proven by clear and convincing evidence, with the burden of proof on special counsel (NRS 1.4673(2)(a)-(b)).
 - c. The right to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law, following a hearing, within sixty (60) days of said hearing (NRS

- d. The right to a determination as to whether discipline is appropriate in these matters and what form that discipline should take (NRS 1.4677).
- 7. Respondent further agrees and acknowledges that this Order will be published on the Commission's website and filed with the Clerk of the Nevada Supreme Court.
- 8. The Commission agrees and acknowledges that once all actions are dismissed, this Order will be posted on the Commission's website and the FSOC in Case Nos. 2018-120 and 2019-005 will be removed. However, Respondent agrees and acknowledges that the FSOC is, and must remain, a public document under Nevada law.
- 9. Respondent agrees and acknowledges that the VSC in Case No. 2019-090 has never been posted to the Commission's website, but also agrees and acknowledges that the VSC is, and must remain, a public document under Nevada law.
- 10. The Commission hereby stipulates to dismiss all pending matters before the Commission against Respondent, with prejudice. The Commission further agrees to take no further action against Respondent on any further matters, whether known or unknown.
- 11. The Respondent hereby stipulates to dismiss her pending action in the United States District Court for the District of Nevada, Case No. 2:21-cv-00381-JCM-BNW, Melanie Andress-Tobiasson v. Nevada Commission on Judicial Discipline, et al., via the filing of a Voluntary Dismissal With Prejudice contemporaneous with the immediate effect of this Order, upon written notice to counsel for Respondent that this Order has now taken effect.
- 12. The Respondent hereby further stipulates to immediately tender her resignation of her position as a Justice of the Peace in Las Vegas Township, Clark County, State of Nevada, to become effective May 7, 2021, via an appropriate communication to the Clark County Commission (copied to Richard Dreitzer, Prosecuting Officer for the Nevada Commission on Judicial Discipline ("NCJD") who will then convey this fact to the NCJD) and to meet any other requirements to vacate her judicial office contemporaneous with the immediate effect of this Order, upon written notice to counsel for Respondent that this Order has now taken effect.

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13. The Respondent hereby further stipulates that after vacating her judicial office, she will neither seek nor accept judicial office in the State of Nevada at any time in the future, nor will she undertake or perform any duty within the definition of "Judge" set forth in NRS 1.428.

- 14. The Respondent understands and agrees that, by accepting the terms of this Order, she waives her right to appeal to the Nevada Supreme Court, pursuant to Rule 3D of the Nevada Rules of Appellate Procedure, which provides Respondent the right to take an appeal of this Order to the Nevada Supreme Court within fourteen (14) days after service upon her (NRAP 3D(d)). Respondent also waives all other forms of extraordinary relief for purposes of challenging this Order.
- 15. The Respondent understands and agrees that the Hearing in this matter that is scheduled to commence on May 17, 2021 at 8:00 a.m. before the Commission, will remain on calendar for a period of fourteen (14) days from the date this Order takes immediate effect, until the appeal period set forth in NRAP 3D(d) is exhausted.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent's resignation and the dismissal of all pending matters before the Commission against the Respondent (subject to each of the terms and conditions within this Order) is approved and accepted by Respondent and the Prosecuting Officers for the Commission, as set forth herein.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Executive Director of the Commission take the necessary steps to file this document in the appropriate records and on the website of the Commission and with the Clerk of the Nevada Supreme Court.
