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13 **FORMAL STATEMENT OF CHARGES**

14 COMES NOW, Richard I. Dreitzer, Prosecuting Officer for the Nevada Commission on  
15 Judicial Discipline ("Commission" or "NCJD"), established under Article 6, §21 of the Nevada  
16 Constitution, who, in the name of and by the authority of the Commission, as found in NRS  
17 1.425 – 1.4695, files this Formal Statement of Charges and informs the Honorable Richard  
18 Scotti, District Court Judge, Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County, State of Nevada  
19 ("Respondent" or "Judge Scotti"), that the following acts were committed by Respondent and  
20 warrant disciplinary action by the Commission under the Revised Nevada Code of Judicial  
21 Conduct ("the Code").

22 **FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

23 During the period spanning March 23, 2017 and May 1, 2017, Respondent knowingly  
24 and in the capacity of his office as a District Court Judge, Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark  
25 County, State of Nevada ("District Court"), engaged in the following acts, or a combination of  
26 these acts ("acts" or "actions"):

27 A. Respondent presided over the criminal trial in the matter of *State of Nevada v.*  
28 *Jose Azucena*, which involved allegations of multiple sex offenses against children and related

1 charges. While conducting voir dire in that matter, a prospective juror expressed to Respondent  
2 that she did not feel she could be impartial because her work as a nurse exposed her to child  
3 abuse. Respondent then became angered, and threw a book against a wall, cursed, berated,  
4 yelled at and threatened the prospective juror for creating what the Respondent appeared to  
5 believe was a contrived excuse to avoid jury service. Respondent ultimately excused the  
6 potential juror from the venire. When voir dire continued, the next prospective juror admitted  
7 that she had suffered sexual abuse as a child, yet did not raise any concerns about her ability to  
8 be impartial. Thereafter, no other prospective jurors raised any biases or any concerns about  
9 their potential impartiality.

10 Ultimately, the jury convicted Defendant, Jose Azucena of twelve counts of lewdness  
11 with a child under the age of 14, seven counts of child abuse, neglect or endangerment; five  
12 counts of indecent exposure; four counts of attempted lewdness with a child under the age of 14;  
13 and one count each of first-degree kidnapping and sexual assault of a minor under 14 years of  
14 age.

15 Defendant, Jose Azucena subsequently appealed his conviction to the Nevada Supreme  
16 Court, which was reversed and remanded. On September 5, 2019, in the matter of *Jose Azucena*  
17 *v. State of Nevada*, 136 Nev. Adv. Op. 36 (2019), the Nevada Supreme Court specifically  
18 indicated that the basis for its reversal and remand was a direct consequence of the above-  
19 described facts. In the Court's words:

20 *We conclude that such behavior and statements constitute*  
21 *judicial misconduct* and may have discouraged other prospective  
22 jurors from answering candidly about their own biases. Because  
23 we cannot be convinced that an impartial jury was selected under  
24 these circumstances where the judge did nothing to alleviate the  
intimidating atmosphere that he created, we reverse and remand for  
a new trial.

25 *Id.*, 136 Nev. Adv. Op. 36, at pg. 2 (emphasis added.)

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1 Moreover, the Nevada Supreme Court's opinion also noted that:

2 "A trial judge has a responsibility to maintain order and decorum  
3 in trial proceedings." *Oade*, 114 Nev. at 621, 960 P.2d at 338.  
4 The judicial canons require a judge to "be patient, dignified and  
5 courteous to... jurors." NCJC Canon 2, Rule 2.8 (B), and to "act  
6 at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the  
7 independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary and...  
8 avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety," NCJC  
9 Canon 1, Rule 1.2. We have previously "urged judges to be  
10 mindful of the influence they wield" over jurors, as a trial judge's  
11 words and conduct are likely "...to mold the opinion of the  
12 members of the jury to the extent that one or the other side of the  
13 controversy may be prejudiced." *Parodi*, 111 Nev. at 367-68, 892  
14 P.2d at 589-90 (internal quotation marks omitted).

15 *Id.*, 136 Nev. Adv. Op. 36, at pg. 6.

16 Respondent's statements and actions during the trial in the matter of *State of Nevada v.*  
17 *Jose Azucena*, therefore, violated Canon 1 of the Code, Rule 1.1, requiring the Respondent to  
18 comply with the law, including the Code itself; and Rule 1.2, requiring the Respondent to act at  
19 all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity and  
20 impartiality of the judiciary and avoiding impropriety and the appearance of impropriety; Canon  
21 2 of the Code, Rule 2.5(A), requiring the Respondent to perform his judicial duties competently;  
22 and Rule 2.8(B), requiring the Respondent to be patient, dignified and courteous, and act and  
23 speak with decorum and maintain a proper judicial demeanor.

24 B. The Respondent abused his judicial authority by engaging in any or all of the acts  
25 set forth in Paragraph A, above.

### 26 COUNT ONE

27 By his words and actions during the trial in the matter of *State of Nevada v. Jose Azucena*  
28 over the period spanning March 23, 2017 and May 1, 2017, as specifically alleged above, the  
Respondent violated Canon 1 of the Code, Rule 1.1, requiring the Respondent to comply with the  
law, including the Code itself; and Rule 1.2, requiring the Respondent to act at all times in a  
manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity and impartiality of the  
judiciary and avoiding impropriety and the appearance of impropriety; Canon 2 of the Code,  
Rule 2.5(A), requiring the Respondent to perform his judicial duties competently; and Rule

1 2.8(B), requiring the Respondent to be patient, dignified and courteous, and act and speak with  
2 decorum and maintain a proper judicial demeanor.

3 Based upon the information set forth herein, the Commission shall hold a public hearing  
4 on the merits of these facts and Count One pursuant to NRS 1.4673 and, if violations as alleged  
5 are found to be true, the Commission shall impose whatever sanctions and/or discipline it deems  
6 appropriate pursuant to NRS 1.4677 and other Nevada Revised Statutes governing the  
7 Commission.

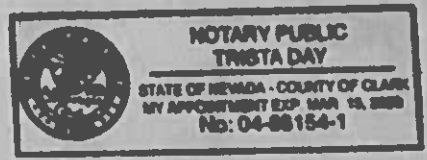
